### Sneak Peak into 5<sup>th</sup> Grade

In August, students will spend the first month in their own classroom as they begin adding and subtracting with fractions and mixed numbers. I will arrive to school after Labor Day to begin pulling students who will benefit from some extra practice.

Again, in 5<sup>th</sup> grade I typically pull out a group of students twice a week for a half hour. Depending on the schedule, I will also be extra support in the math classroom twice a week.

The first unit of fifth grade really pushes students to jump right back into math. You can help prepare your student by having them review fraction concepts over the summer.
